Great British Spring Clean

We had a fantastic response to the **Great British Spring Clean** which took place
between 29 May to 13 June this year.

The annual campaign from Keep Britain
Tidy is a great way to encourage people to
consider litter picking, individually or as part
of an organised group, to support their local
community.



We had volunteers of all ages taking part, with many trying litter picking for the first time, including a number of beaver and cub scout groups, staff and residents from Solihull Community Housing, service users from various charities like Social Life Opportunities and Colebridge Trust, as well as various schools who took part in the Great Big School Clean.

One resident-led group - Cars Area Together (Smith's Wood) - used the litter pick as an activity to engage with local residents, getting together afterwards for half-term games and refreshments on a nearby field.

Several of our established community groups and friends of parks organisations also took the opportunity to carry out their first in-person group litter pick of the year, and had a great time catching up with friends in the fresh air.

Love Solihull provided support throughout the campaign, loaning equipment to various groups and arranging bag collections, making the 2021 Great British Spring Clean another huge success for Solihull.

A special thank you to all our dedicated volunteers who help keep Solihull looking litter-free all year round. We now have over 500 registered individual litter pickers in the Solihull borough, which shows just how many people are passionate about taking pride in where they live.


